



2000 RETURN TO GIG, GET CHANGED, HAVE A HUGE FASHION CRISIS, IGNORE MY OWN TROUSERS.



IT HAPPENED DURING "CHANCE." STUART LOOKED OUT AT THE HUNDRED THOUSAND PEOPLE, OLD AND YOUNG, SOLDIERS AND CIVILIANS, SOME WITH FLAGS OF THE STARS AND STRIPES, SOME WITH THE HAMMER AND SICKLE, AND SIX YEARS OF PLANNING AND PRAYING, RECORDING AND TOURING SUDDENLY, INSTANTLY, REACHED A PEAK. AS THE SWAYING CROWD CAUGHT UP THE CHORUS AND RETURNED IT TO THE STAGE, THE "OH LORD" SO STRONG IT BROKE OVER THE BAND WITH THE FORCE OF A TIDAL WAVE, TEARS CAME TO HIS EYES. THESE PEOPLE WERE ESTONIAN - SOME WOULD SAY RUSSIAN. THEY HAD NEVER HEARD THE SONG BEFORE, MOST HAD NEVER EVEN SEEN A BAND, AND YET...WELL, THERE THEY WERE, UNBIDDEN SINGING AS ONE, CELEBRATING THE SONG'S SWEET SORROW. SUDDENLY ALL THE WORDS ABOUT PASSION AND HONESTY, ALL THE EPIC HOPES THAT POP RETAINED THE POWER TO COMMUNICATE ON AN INSTICTIVE, EMOTIONAL LEVEL, ALL THE THINGS THE BAND HAD ALWAYS BEEN SAYING BECAME REALITY. SUDDENLY THE NAME BIG COUNTRY MADE AWESOME SENSE.















IT WAS PERFECTLY FITTING THAT BIG COUNTRY SHOULD HAVE BEEN THE FIRST WESTERN BAND TO PLAY TO THE PEOPLE OF THE SOVIET UNION PROPER (AS OPPOSED TO THE HAND-PICKED AUDIENCE OF BUROCRATS OTHERS HAD ENTERTAINED). WHEN STUART TEAMED UP WITH FELLOW GUITARIST BRUCE WATSON, DRUMMER MARK BRZEZICKI AND BASSIST TONY BUTLER IN 1982, THEY EMBARKED ON A DELIBERATE CRUSADE TO HUMANISE POP, TO MAKE IT A SIMPLE, STIRRING LANGUAGE THAT COULD BE FATHOMED BY EVERYONE. THEIR EARLY SINGLES - "HARVEST HOME," "IN A BIG COUNTRY," "FIELDS OF FIRE," "CHANCE" - AND THEIR DEBUT ALBUM "THE CROSSING." CONCERNED THEMSELVES DIRECTLY WITH CREATING A GREAT ROMANTIC SCENERY, A NEW MUSIC WHICH TAPPED INTO TRADITION AND SOUGHT TO MOVE PEOPLE ON A PERSONAL ONE TO ONE BASIS. THEIRS WAS NEITHER POMP NOR BLUSTER BUT A MEETING AND MELTING OF EMOTIONS INTO A TUMULTUOUS SHOW OF UNITY. THEIR SECOND ALBUM, "STEELTOWN," WAS TOUGHER, A POLITICAL STATEMENT (WITH A SMALL "p"), AN ENDICTMENT OF THOSE WHO WOULD STEAL PEOPLE'S LIVELIHOODS, PEOPLE'S PASTS, HOMES, EVEN LIVES FOR THE SAKE OF ECONOMICS. AND MORE, IT WAS CALL TO KEEP THE STRENGTH UP, A VISION OF TRIUMPH IN ADVERSITY. WHILE "WHERE THE ROSE IS SOWN" BEAUTIFULLY CONDEMMED THE WASTEFUL FUTILITY OF WAR (JUST BECAUSE IT'S BEEN SAID BEFORE DOESN'T MEAN IT ISN'T WORTH SAYING AGAIN...AND AGAIN UNTIL IT STOPS!), THE SINGLE "WONDERLAND" BELIEVED IN A FAIRER, BRIGHTER FUTURE. INTENT ON REACHING FARTHER AND WIDER, THE THIRD ALBUM, "THE SEER," FOUND THE BAND EXPERIMENTING WITH FOLK MUSIC. RETRACING THEIR HERITAGE, FINDING OUT THAT WHAT MATTERED THEN IS WHAT MATTERS NOW IS WHAT ALWAYS MATTERS - PEOPLE. JUST PEOPLE. IT WAS RELEASED AFTER LIVE AID, (BIG COUNTRY JOINED IN THE FINALE AT WEMBLEY) AND EXPRESSED AN EVEN MORE OPTIMISTIC OUTLOOK, EXEMPLIFIED BY THE SINGLE, "LOOK AWAY."






AND NOW WE'VE GOT THE "PEACE IN OUR TIME" LP, AND THE MESSAGE COULD HARDLY BE MADE MORE CLEAR, WHILE STYLISTICALLY THE SONGS SOUND LIKE A BUNCH OF FANS HAVING FUN WITH MUSIC, EMULATING THEIR HEROES — "KING OF EMOTION" IS PROBABLY THE FIRST ROCK SONG THIS BAND HAVE EVER WRITTEN — THE LYRICS ARE MORE INTENT THAN EVER ON HELPING ESTABLISH INTERNATIONAL ARMISTICE. AND SO IT WAS THAT BIG COUNTRY VISITED THE SOVIET UNION, APPLAUDED MR GORBACHEV'S DISARMAMENT INITIATIVES, FORCED THE WORLD'S PRESS TO LOOK AGAIN AT POP'S POTENTIAL TO EFFECT A CULTURAL EXCHANGE AND, MOST IMPORTANT OF ALL, SHARED THEIR SONGS WITH PEOPLE — PEOPLE WHO TOOK THEM TO THEIR HEARTS.





























THE SINGLES
